Estimated Time for Lesson: 30 minutes

1. What is the lesson objective?

Students will learn about the *Swastika* and Star of David, where they originated, and how they were used during WWII.

2. Anticipatory Set:

Inform students that I will discuss the Swastika and Star of David by using a Prezi presentation.

3. Teaching Process, Guided Practice & Monitoring:

At the beginning of class, I will tell the students to open their Anne Frank workbooks and take notes on the Swastika under the Nazi section, and on the Star of David under the Judaism section. I will then present using Prezi, explaining each slide and checking for understanding.

4. Closure:

After the presentation, I will have a class discussion guided by questions to help students make sense of what has just been taught.

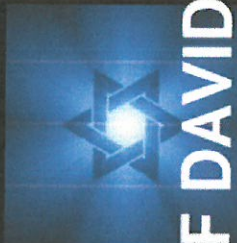

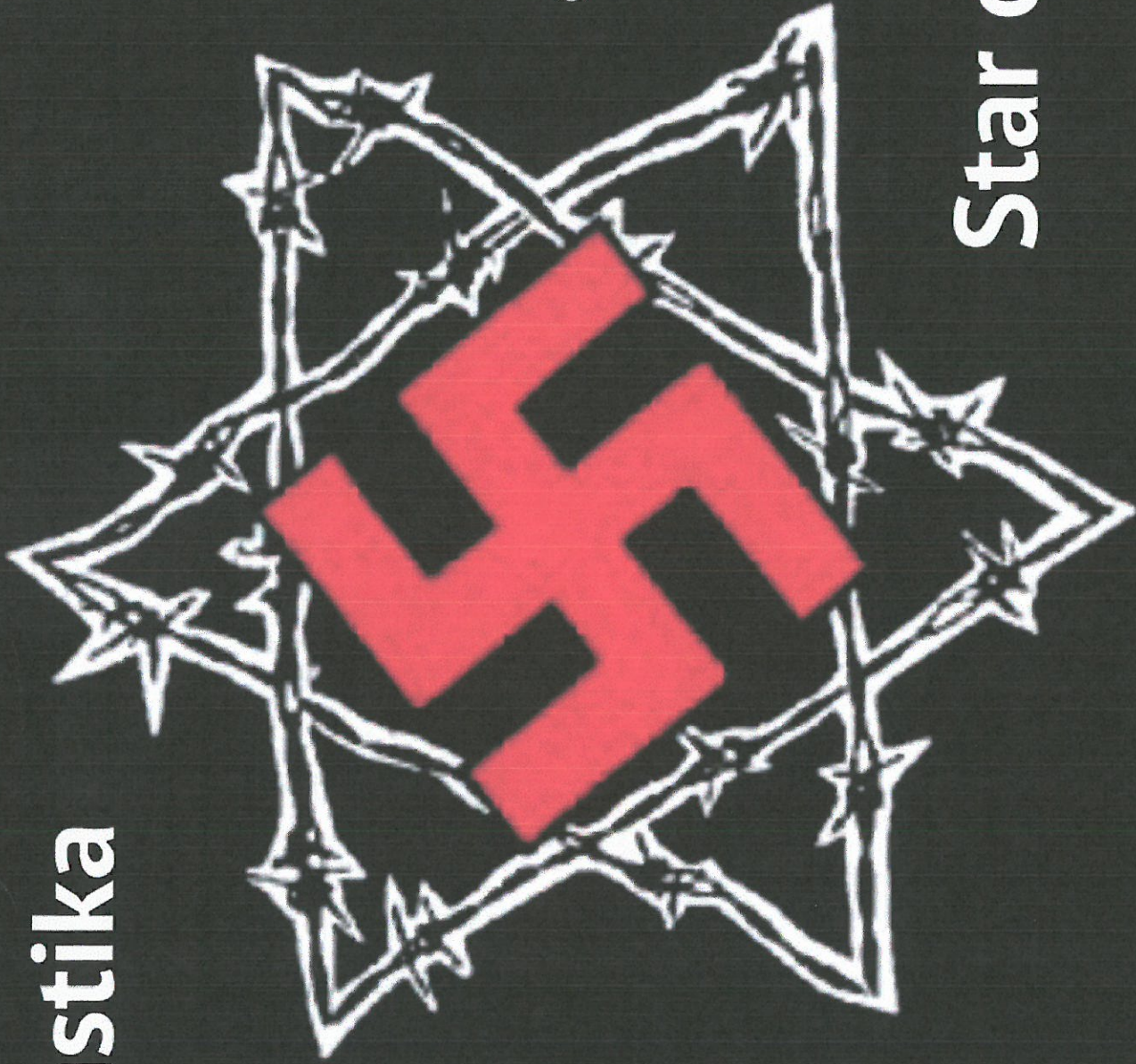

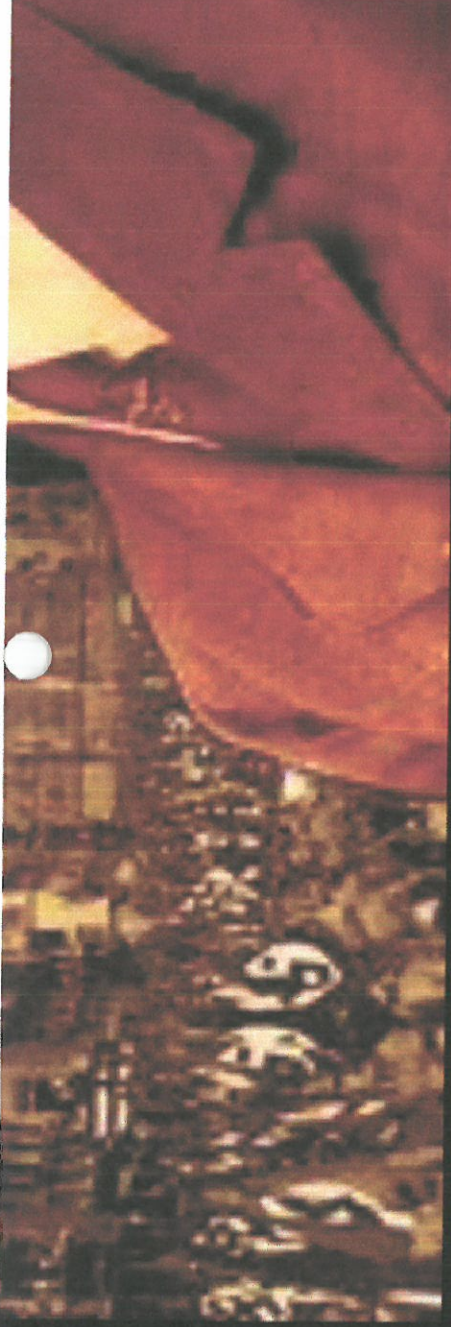

THE SWASTIKA



The word "swastika" comes from the Sanskrit svastika - "su" (meaning "good") combined with "asti" (meaning "it is"), along with the diminutive suffix "ka." The swastika literally means "it is good."





A swastika was adopted as a symbol of the Nazi Party of Germany in 1920, who used the swastika as a symbol of the Aryan race.

After Adolf Hitler came to power in 1933, a right-facing 45° rotated swastika was incorporated into the flag of the Nazi Party, which was made the state flag of Germany during the Nazi era. Hence in many western countries the swastika is stigmatized as being associated with Nazism and related concepts like antisemitism, hatred, violence, death, and murder.



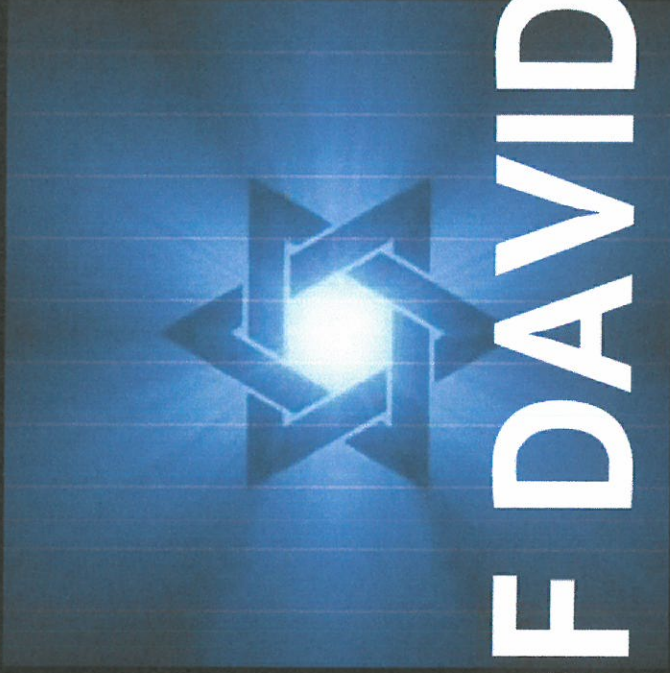
Because of its use by Nazi Germany, the swastika since the 1930s has been largely associated with Nazism and white supremacy in most Western countries. As a result, all of its use, or its use as a Nazi or hate symbol is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Many buildings that have contained the symbol as decoration have had them removed.

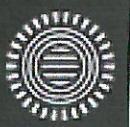
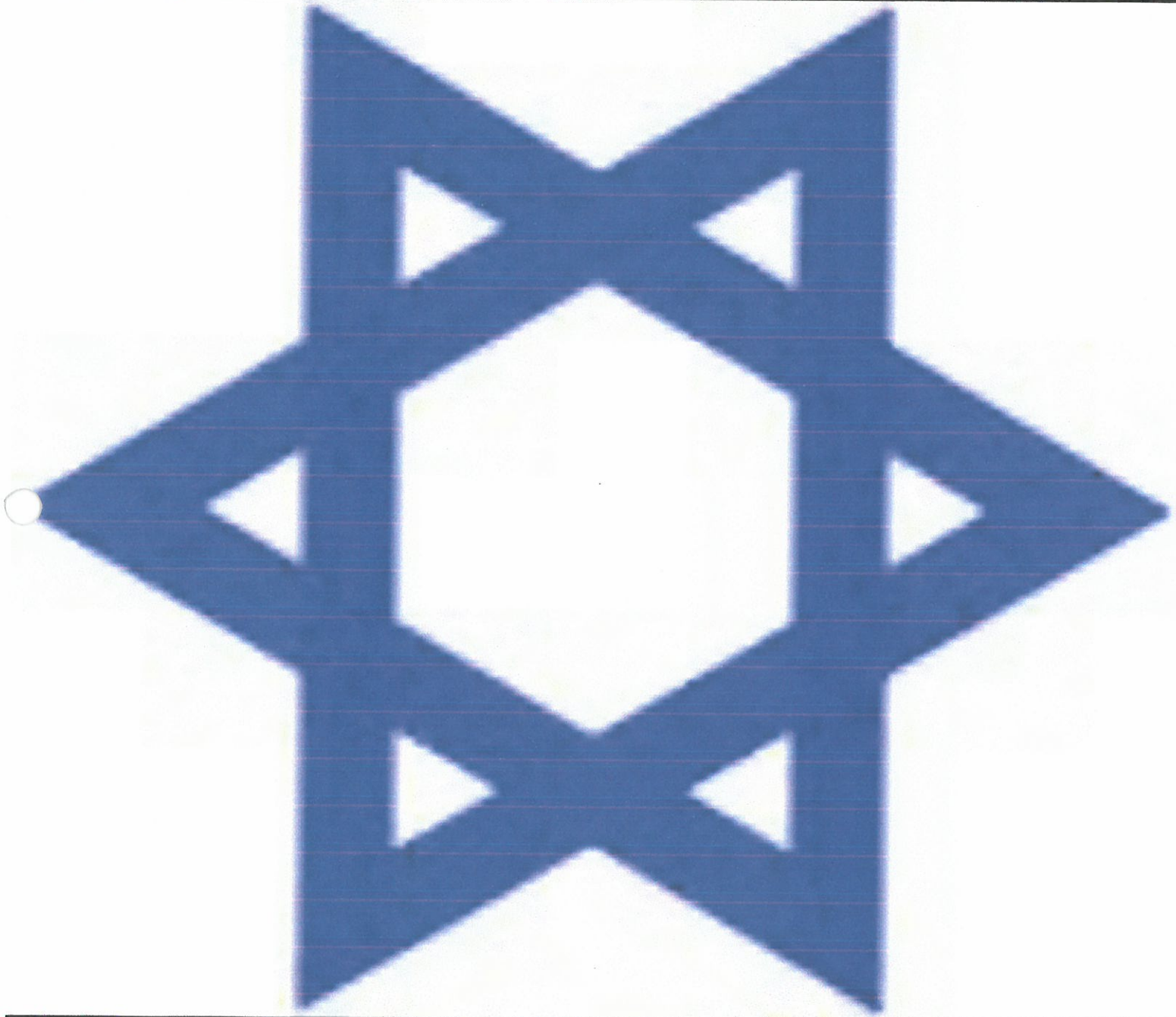
THE STAR OF DAVID



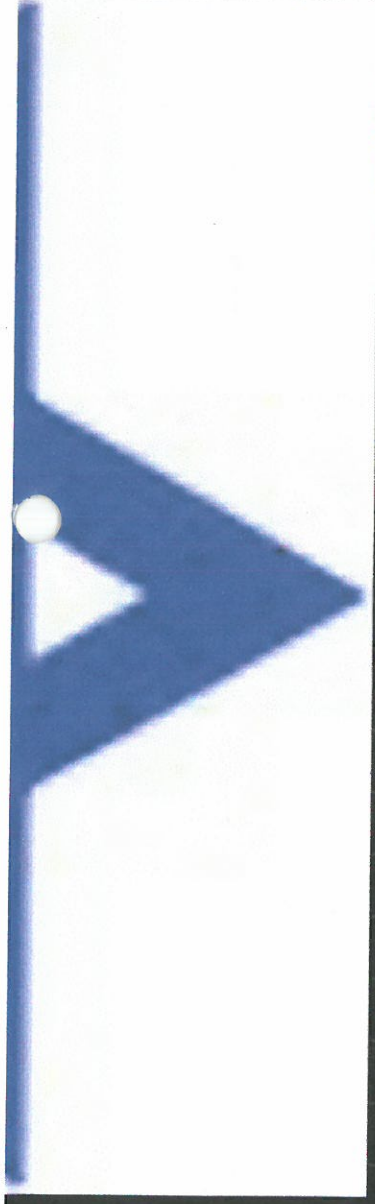
There are many ideas about the symbolic meaning of the Star of David. One idea was that the six points represented God's rule over the universe in all six directions: north, south, east, west, up and down. They also believed that the star could be used as protection against evil spirits.

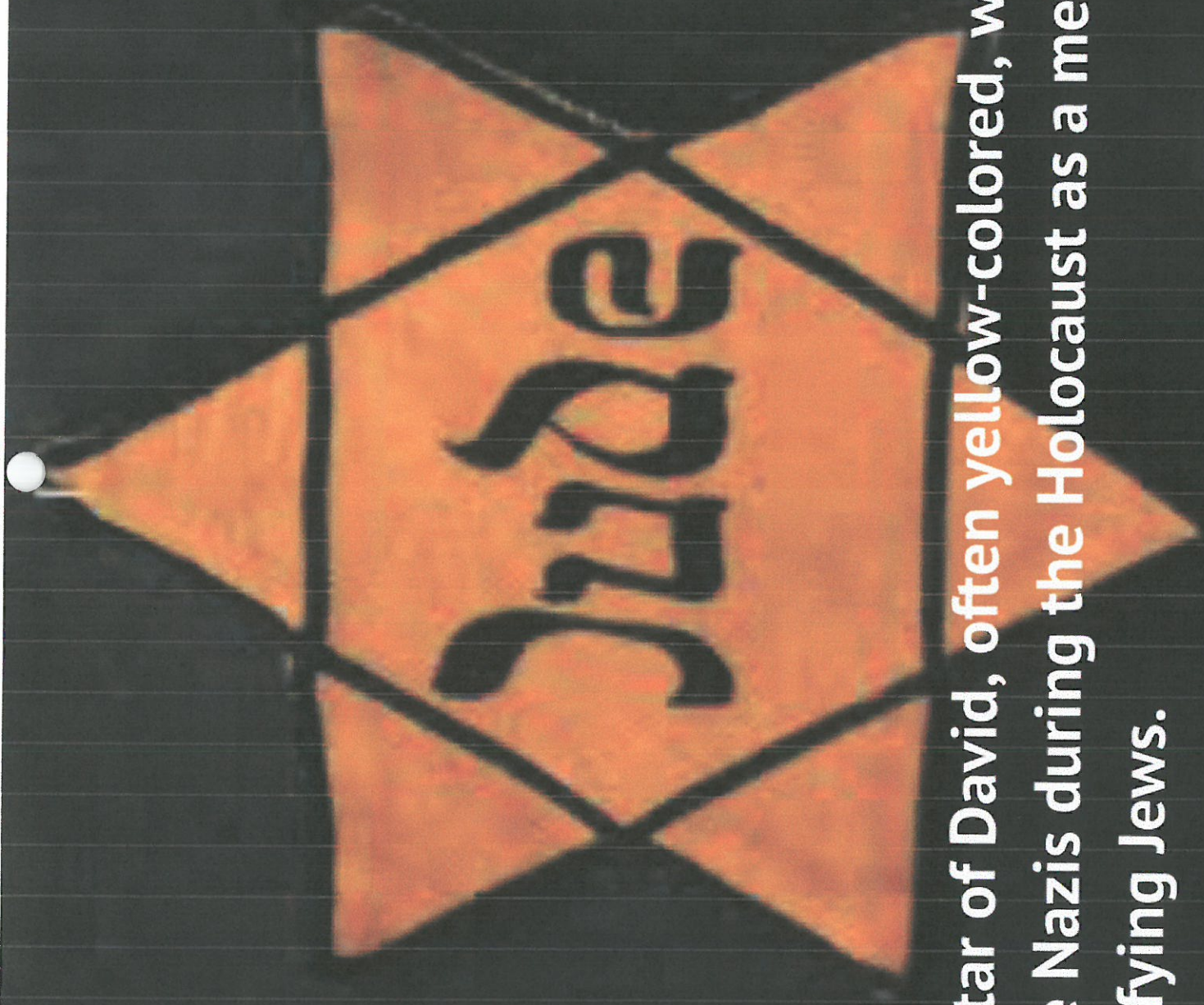


The Star of David is also known as the Shield of David, in Hebrew. This symbol recognizes Jews and Judaism. The symbol's association with King David comes from many Jewish legends. His shield was composed of two interlocking triangles attached to the back of a round shield. At one point the battle became so intense that the two triangles were fused together, and became known as the Star of David.

The structure of the Star of David has been thought to represent the relationship between God and the Jewish people. The star that points up symbolizes God and the star that points down represents us on earth.

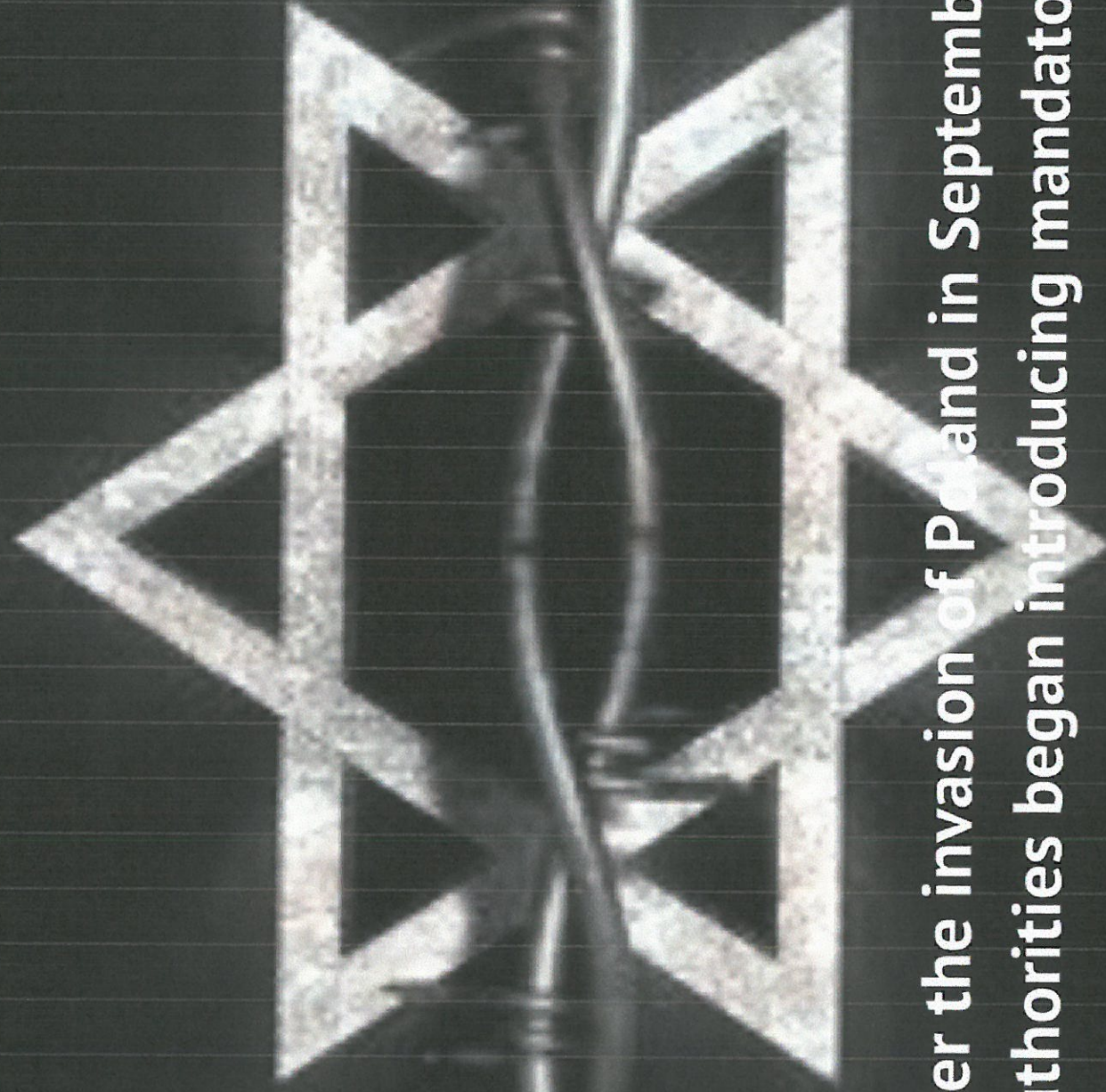


The Star of David, often yellow-colored, was used by the Nazis during the Holocaust as a method of identifying Jews.

Shortly after the invasion of Poland in September 1939, local German authorities began introducing mandatory wearing of

badges.



The German government's policy of forcing Jews to wear identifying badges was but one of many psychological tactics aimed at isolating and dehumanizing the Jews of Europe, directly marking them as being different (i.e., inferior) to everyone else. It allowed for the easier facilitation of their separation from society and subsequent ghettoization, which ultimately led to the deportation and murder of 6 million Jews.
